They learn or enhance their leadership skills by applying those skills throughout the course, attending and participating in skills development exercises, lectures and presentations and consciously noting where the skills are used, how they are used or misused, and when the presence of skills enhances communication, learning, and effectiveness. Through application of skills and information gained during Leadership Duncan to the community following graduation, our community sees increasing levels of volunteerism, increasing levels of advocacy, increasing levels of community involvement and service.
